BAYSHORE/GATEWAY TRIANGLE LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES OF October 07, 2025, MEETING

The meeting of the Bayshore/Gateway Triangle Local Redevelopment Advisory Board was called to order by Chairman, Maurice Guiterrez, at 6:02 p.m.

III. Invocation & Pledge of Allegiance

Maurice Guiterrez led the Pledge of Allegiance

IV. Adoption of Agenda:

CRA Action: Motion made by Al Schantzen to accept the agenda as amended; second by Kristin Hood; approved unanimously. 8-0

Shirley Garcia requested that Road Maintenance presentation be moved after Public Safety Report as 7b.

CRA Action: Motion made by Maurice Gutierrez to accept board members on zoom to vote; second by Al Schantzen; approved unanimously. 8-0

V. Public to be Heard (Non-Agenda Items)

Kathy Shaw (Resident- Danford Street) commented that she had questions about Road Maintenance.

Shirley Garcia commented that CRA projects updates for the Danford Street project will be for the Danford Street Road project that the CRA is partnering with the Road Maintenance Division that will be completing the maintenance of the road. Mrs. Garcia commented that CRA will be partnering with the City of Naples to do the water

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lines, public utilities will do the wastewater manhole covers and also stormwaters. Mrs. Garcia commented that there are no other projects on Danford Street that have a complete design or any updates at this point.

Kathy Shaw commented that a neighbor advised her of a design, and he has seen a project design for Danford Street.

John Dunnuck commented that the information that the residents are receiving from their neighbor is not true. Mr. Dunnuck commented that the only design that was shown to their neighbors was the conceptual design that was presented to the board that conveys how the project could look in the future.

Kathy Shaw commented that her concern was the great length of trading of properties across the street of her home. Also putting a road in front of her home.

John Dunnuck commented that CRA is following the board's action to acquire the properties that is required for the project. Mr. Dunnuck commented that the concept would still be to close off Danford Street if successful and reroute traffic from Bay Street into the park.

Cindy Tutino asked has the board received anything from the appraisals companies and will the residents be contacted once a response is received?

John Dunnuck commented that the board has not received any response from the appraisals, and the Danford Street residents will be notified when an appraisal is completed and received by the advisory board.

VI. Approval of Consent Agenda:

a. September 4, 2025, Meeting Minutes

CRA Action: Motion made by Al Schantzen to accept September 4, 2025, meeting minutes; second by Kristin Hood.; approved unanimously 8-0.

b. Financial Report

Al Schantzen commented that Danford Street project is not on the September financial report.

Shirley Garcia commented that the financial report was published in September, so those prior to the changes of the budget amendment that was on the Boad of County Commissioners agenda. Mrs. Garcia commented that a project list update will be presented to the board for the October and November meeting, including Danford Street.

VII. County Agencies and Presentations:

a. Public Safety Report by Sergeant Allen Tuff:

Sergeant Tuff was unavailable to attend the meeting.

Corporal Carrozza commented that he has collected some information about the questions that were asked in last month's meeting. Corporal Carrozza commented that this information includes calls related to services, including burglaries, traffic crashes, drug related complaints, noise complaints, robberies, shootings, vehicles stolen and traffic stops. Corporal Carrozza commented that for the month of August and September, there was (1) burglary reported. Traffic crashes decreased by 10 from August to September from 47 to 37. Corporal Carrozza commented that Danford Street drug sales activities decreased from 18 to 8 for the month of August.

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Corporal Carrozza commented that (6) noise complaints was reported for the month of August, (0) robberies and (1) shooting for the month of September. Corporal Carrozza commented that (1) vehicles were stolen for the month of August and (2) for September. Corporal Carrozza commented that there were (253) traffic stops for August and (220) for September. Corporal Carrozza commented that he made (2) traffic stops on Danford Street. Corporal Carrozza commented that (22) traffic stops were conducted on South Bayshore.

Shirley Garcia commented that she has community outreach brochures that provide information to available services throughout the county.

Kristin Hood asked for an update to a crime that had taken place near Community Blvd. last month.

Corporal Carrozza commented that the department was not able to determine if a crime had occurred in the area, after speaking with witnesses and obtaining video footage.

Al Schantzen commented that on September 20, 2025, while volunteering for the Collier County Cleanup, the gate fence under the Bayshore bridge had been broken. Shirley Garcia commented that Road Maintenance went out and put a padlock on the fence to help with securing the gate.

Corporal Carrozza commented that he will visit the site upon leaving the meeting.

b. Road Maintenance CRA Project Updates Report

Marshal Miller (Collier County Road Maintenance Division Director) introduced Eric Montalvo (Project Manager1) to discuss road maintenance project updates. Mr. Montalvo discussed the Bayshore Stormwater Project Area 1: Pine, Becca, and Weeks Stormwater Improvements. Mr. Montalvo commented that during the last change order, the division included implementation, the relocation of the wastewater force main and the improvements to the City of Naples water main. Mr. Montalvo commented that Ed Blow (Engineer) has recently submitted some 30% plans over to the City of Naples water main for review, and also 30% plans for the forest main, wastewater Main Relocation, PUD for review. Mr. Montalvo commented that upon a recent meeting with the City of Naples, they agreed with the plans. Mr. Montalvo commented that there are a few adjustments, which include going back to PUD to talk to see if they are acceptable to the plans. Mr. Montalvo commented that until the review process is done, the division will be closing into 90% plans for the entire work order, and then 100% moving forward to the construction stage.

Shirley Garcia commented that she will be setting up the interlocal agreement as they wait for public utilities to agree, so that the City of Naples will be on a reimbursement. Mrs. Garcia commented that hopefully the interlocal agreement will be placed on the November agenda for the City Council and then move forward to the Board of County Commissioners' monthly meeting in December.

Eric Montalvo discussed the Bayshore Stormwater Project Area 4: Gateway Triangle: Linwood Way and Bayside St Stormwater Improvements. Mr. Montalvo commented that currently the division is moving towards the 9% plans, however, there was a little hiccup with the City of Naples water main, where the division was

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going to relocate the city water, in order to make room for a new stormwater system. Mr. Montalvo commented that the City of Naples did not have the current division engineer on their library list, so the division had to go into an interlocal agreement with them. Mr. Montalvo commented that the division will be designing and constructing the plans, and the City of Naples will reimburse the division at the end. Shirley Garcia commented that she will be preparing a project agreement for the City of Naples, because they prefer a separate interlocal agreement for each project and will then be placed on the City Council meeting agenda.

Al Schantzen asked a question pertaining to Project Area. Mr. Schantzen asked, is obtaining legal descriptions for the easements of acquisition from a surveyor, that is obtaining easement from a general public property owner?

Eric Montalvo responded that yes, throughout the project there are going to be about 6 different properties that the division will acquire easements from in order to access the outfalls out in the canals. Mr. Montalvo commented that the division is currently getting the legal description and the surveyor, sketch, before contacting the homeowners to go about acquiring these easements.

Al Schantzen asked, does this put the feasibility of the overall project at jeopardy, being that there has not been any dialogue with the homeowners?

Eric Montalvo commented that he believes that Richard Orff, previous project manager, has had some communication with the homeowner before, however, the division would have to contact the homeowner again to see if they do recall having any communication with the previous project manager, and if they are still willing to give the easements for the projects.

Shirley Garcia commented that there were going to be 8 properties, but the division determined that it was going to be 6.

Eric Montalvo confirmed Shirley Garcia comments.

Al Schantzen asked, "Are there any problems with the outfalls, because there are easements already."

Eric Montalvo commented that there is no problem with the outfalls. Mr. Montalvo commented that the outfalls are currently proposed to be on the homeowners' property, however, the division plans to acquire those easements after the design has been completed, so that the division is able to present the plans and acquire those easements via to the right of way acquisition department. Mr. Montalvo commented that in order for Stormwater to be able to go to 90%, the division is relying on the project plans that are being built up. Mr. Montalvo commented that once the plans reach 90%, hopefully hand-in-hand out the stormwater, they are able to reach 90% as well and then 100% when everything has been completed in one single plan sheet. Al Schantzen asked, when the project plans get to 90%, will there be a general idea of the cost of building out?

Eric Montalvo responded Yes, for the Are Project 1. Mr. Montalvo commented that there will be an estimated as the engineers estimated probable cost for the project and they will be included once the engineer submits 90% plans.

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Kristin Hood asked, "will this upcoming project, help to alleviate the flooding West of Bayshore, or would that have to be a separate project?

Eric Montalvo responded yes. Mr. Montalvo commented that the upcoming project is in hope of mitigating the flooding from the rainfall throughout this area as well. Marshall Miller commented that the project plans for west of Bayshore are going to be a different project. Mr. Miller commented that he could provide an update on that project at a later date. Mr. Miler commented that there is going to be an alleyway project that the division is currently working on with Stormwater Capital. Mr. Miller commented that there was funding made available, but no design was ever proposed. Mr. Miller commented that he met with the person that is running the Legion, and received information that due to last rainy season's issues, their alleyway always floods on the way down to the pizza joint before it could get through what used to be a historical ditch to the pond. Mr. Miller commented that the division is looking to acquire maintenance rights to the pond, but there is no promise to create or recreate the ditch that used to be there going over that way, since the division maintains the wire and cross pipes from the pond to the outfall location where it goes through the City of Naples over by Sandpiper. Mr. Miller commented that the division is currently trying to acquire maintenance rights. Mr. Miller commented that the division is going to look at designing, to make a dual outfall situation to where the division can outfall to the pond and outfall to the side streets, however, there is no promise on these actions. Mr. Miller commented that there will have to be a bigger project in the future to look at the drainage inside that neighborhood, because it is large.

Shirely Garcia commented that the division can bring the project plan back to the CRA advisory board or Stormwater Subcommittee for partnership.

Marshall Miller commented that the division is still in the theoretical phase. Mr. Miller commented that if the division is able to acquire enough area and rights to maintain the areas outside of the alleyway, could the division design a project is what is being first pursued. Mr. Miller commented once he gets updates on the alleyway process, he will provide it to Shirley Garcia and John Dunnuck.

Eric Montalvo commented that Area 4, The Gateway Triangle is currently working with the City of Naples for the main relocation of the water, and the division is waiting for an interlocal agreement to be included in the project. Mr. Montalvo commented that the design is currently at a stop work order, until the division is able to get the interlocal agreement and meet with the City of Naples, so that they are able to include their design into the division project. Mr. Montalvo commented that once the division engineer of record and the City of Naples meet, they will receive a proposal, issue a charge order and move forward with the remainder of the project. John Dunnuck commented that he will try to get a blanket interlocal agreement on the upcoming projects to move them forward faster. Mr. Dunnuck commented that he will be reaching out to Commissioner Kowal to increase the skids a little better. Eric Montalvo discussed the Rehabilitation Design Services for Pine Tree Dr, Andrews Ave Woodside Ave. Mr. Montalvo commented that the division has come

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to an agreement with the Bayshore CRA that this project is currently at a stop work order in order to work on some permitting issues that the division has. Mr. Montalvo commented that the steps the division will be taking, including the Bayshore CRA, will be maintaining and meeting the construction of Pine Tree Drive, Andrews Avenue, and Woodside Avenue. Mr. Montalvo commented that once the project has been completed, and the roadways and stormwater system on these three roads are up to standards, they will be transferred to the county for regular county maintenance. Mr. Montalvo commented that this will require a meeting with the Board of County Commissioners. Mr. Montalvo commented that the engineer has encountered some issues with the outfalls that the division wants to clarify with the engineer. Mr. Montalvo commented that once this process is complete, the division will start the order back up again, receive the permits and transfer over for construction.

Maurice Gutierrez asked, are Pine Tree Drive, Andrews Avenue, Woodside Avenue, the last remaining streets for projects to be completed in this district?

Shirely Gracia responded no, they are not the last, because she has identified more streets into the design. Mrs. Garcia commented that she will be putting together a list of other roads that the Bayshore CRA has that are not of the county standards.

Marshall Miller commented that the three roads are the last for the Bayshore CRA area. Mr. Miller commented that the roads need to be converted to current FDOT standards to be taken over for maintenance. Mr. Miller commented that the division does see a valid public purpose that will be able to make a argument with the CRA to the Board of County Commissioners.

Al Schantzen asked, Pine Tree Drive, Andrews Avenue, Woodside Avenue, although the division have the stop order for these projects, will they be going forth with stormwater to get that in line before doing the maintenance on the road?

Eric Montalvo responded that is what the construction vendor will require. Mr. Montalvo commented that is what the division is waiting for the district permits. Mr. Montalvo commented that once the division receives the required permits it will issue a stop work order again to go to 100% plans and then transfer over to construction.

Eric Montalvo discussed Roadway Maintenance for Danford Street. Mr. Montalvo commented that there has been a lot of back and forth with different agencies for this project. Mr. Montalvo commented that the division had PUDs, wastewater and sewer included in this to improve some manual linings and clean upgrades. Mr. Montalvo commented that the division also included the City of Naples water main improvements. Mr. Montalvo commented that the division has included their engineering record to include a concept design of the roadway. Mr. Montalvo commented that Shirley Garcia is working on getting the division a project number for this project, and they are also going to need an interlocal agreement with the City of Naples for this project.

John Dunnuck commented that staff have designated the pathway to be on the north side of the road. Mr. Dunnuck commented that it makes sense for pedestrians to

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cross, because it connects to the current sidewalk off Hamiliton, it connects to Bayshore Park. Mr. Dunnuck commented that there is 60 feet in the Danford Street project, and the project requires 60 feet to be utilized.

Marshall Miller confirmed that 60 feet will need to be used for the project. Mr. Miller commented that the division should not just be put in a walkway and road, it needs a good area, a curb, for the design concept to come up with a couple of different ways to complete the project. Mr. Miller commented that the project is being done to put in a life, health and safety standard for the roadway, it is not for beautification, or lighting or anything else. Mr. Miller commented that the division sees a need for dedicated walking paths for the public, a need for rehabilitation of the driving lanes and a need to bring into compliance the stormwater system on both sides of the roadway.

c. Development Report by Laura DeJohn, Johnson Engineering

Laura DeJohn discussed Development Updates for the month of October. Mrs. DeJohn commented that 2415 Linwood Ave: PL20250008735, staff issued a zoning verification letter on 9/5/2025 indicating that the property is not zoned for use as a wholesale motor vehicle dealer operation. Asked for whole motor zoning, received a no for the request. Mr. DeJohn discussed Oakes Farm Davis PL20250010003, preapp meeting held on 8/20/2025. Mrs. DeJohn discussed Bayshore RPUD PL20250003046, applicant currently waiting to get review initiated. Mrs. DeJohn discussed The Grove PL20250000077, staff issued first comment letter on 9/3/2025, requesting a variance t increase the height of entry feature gates from 42" to 11.6". Requires a public hearing; a decision will be made by the Hearing Examiner. Mr. DeJohn discussed Brookside MPUD PL20240010963, BCC approved on 9/23/2025. Mrs. DeJohn discussed Brookside Marina PL20250002817, First applicant submittal on 9/16/2025, in for first review. Mrs. DeJohn discussed Huey Magoos PL20240009817, HEX approval issued on 9/15/2025. Mrs. DeJohn discussed the Linwood Auto Storage PL20250009519, request for insubstantial change, need to adjust site features. Mrs. DeJohn discussed Bayshore Drive Single Family Homes PL20240009862, second applicant submittal on 9/24/2025, construction plans and plat (PPL) application for three fee-simple single-family lots. Mrs. DeJohn discussed the 2360 Shadowlawn Drive PL20250009014, Brian Cordero requested verification the property can be used as an outdoor power equipment sales center/dealership which engages in the sale of commercial and residential lawn equipment, aftermarket parts, along with a service/repair center. Mrs. DeJohn discussed the 2360 Shadowlawn Drive PL20250008035, zoning verification letter issued on 8/28/2025, Robert Molina requested verification that automative repair is allowed to establish a state-of-the-art collision repair facility at this location. Mrs. DeJohn discussed 2409 Linwood Ave PL20250008722, verification letter issued on 8/25/2025, yes internet car sale is allowed. Mrs. DeJohn discussed the 844059 Verizon PL20250000302, **SDPI** approval letter issued on 8/28/2025.

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VIII. Old Business:

Project Manager Update

a. 17 Acres Boardwalk

Tami Scott discussed updates for the 17 Acres Boardwalk. Mrs. Scott commented that the project is on its 249th day of a 365-day contract with 116 days to go to meet the January 28th contract date. Mrs. Scott commented that there may be some rainy days and holidays that may push the project completion date to around February 21. Mrs. Scott commented that Bayshore CRA is on the third payout for the project, in which the contract is \$3,365,000,000 with a total of \$510,000 that is to be spent to date. Mrs. Scott commented that the project is 50% complete, which is about 15% of the total cost. Mrs. Scott commented that pay out four will be substantial because the contractor will be billing for all the pilings that were put in. Mrs. Scott commented that there were 120 pilings installed, and it will show in the next payout. Mrs. Scott commented that the team was able to get a crane on the opposite side of the bridge. Mrs. Scott commented that the contractor will start framing the bridge next week. Mrs. Scott commented that the team meet with the Botanical Garden, the landscape architect and contractors to solidify a lot of the items there. Mrs. Scott commented that the landscaping will be starting next week as well. Mrs. Scott commented that the galleons, which are like retaining walls, are in place. Mrs. Scott commented that she is ordering a caution signage for the bridge. Mrs. Scott commented that there will be an entrance sign on the promenade and another on the other side that welcomes you to the bridge. Mrs. Scott offered to give a tour of the bridge.

James Talano asked has the 17-acre boardwalk been re-surveyed since it has been cleared for the project to be completed.

Tami Scott responded that yes it has been re-surveyed, which Shirley Garcia is in charge of getting completed by Stantec. Mrs. Scott discussed the MSTU landscaping project. Mrs. Scott commented that there have been a lot of maintenance issues and a lot of end-of-year items. Mrs. Scott commented that there has been some replanting near the roundabout and trimming on Jeepers Ave.

VIII. New Business

a. CRA/MSTU Manager Report

Shirley Garcia discussed Gateway Triangle Properties. Mrs. Garcia commented that the properties that the Bayshore CRA purchased are the four units, it is two duplexes, with 2 bedrooms and one bathroom. Mrs. Garcia is asking the advisory board to turn the duplexes into a affordable rental until the stormwater project is completed, which will be completed in 5 years. Mrs. Garcia would like the duplexes to be affordable for county employees.

John Dunnuck committed that it is also a safety and security issue. Mr. Dunnuck commented that there have been many break-ins. Mr. Dunnuck commented that there have been cameras and lights installed around the duplexes.

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CRA Action: Motion made by Maurice Gutierrez to approve the property located at 2695 Francis Ave Unit A, C and D to be tun into affordable workforce housing; second by Kristin Hood.; approved unanimously 8-0.

Shirley Garcia discussed the Bay and Danford St. Purchases. Mrs. Garcia commented that appraisals are being completed. Mrs. Garcia commented that staff are negotiating with as many owners as they can to get the appraisals completed. Mrs. Garcia discussed the 17 Acre Outparcels. Mrs. Garcia commented that she is currently working on an Invitation to Negotiate (ITN) to be sent to County Procurement to be added to their list. Mrs. Garcia discussed the CRA Property Maintenance. Mrs. Garcia commented that she went out and submitted it to bid, it has to be out on the streets for 10 days. Mrs. Garcia commented that if it don't get enough bidders, it would have to be reposted for 7 additional days. Mrs. Garcia discussed the CRA Website. Mrs. Garcia commented that Collier County has completed their transition to the new website. Mrs. Garcia commented that the staff is trying to incorporate where the Bayshore CRA will not be separate from the county website. Mrs. Garcia commented that there will be a quarterly newsletter, which the Communication Division will assist with creating those. Mrs. Garcia commented that it will be a subscribe to option added to the website. Mrs. Garcia discussed the Gateway Triangle Masterplan. Mrs. Garcia commented that she is still trying to get the scope through procurements. Mrs. Garcia discussed the CRA/MSTU Partnership for Holiday Decorations. Mrs. Garcia commented that the holiday decorations have been put out for a bid, and there has been a low bidder. Mrs. Garcia discussed Solar Lighting vs. Electric. Mrs. Garcia commented that she is going to take a average bill for every maintenance of FP&L, the light installation of FP&L. and the yearly fees paid for electric versus solar light. Mrs. Garcia discussed the City of Naples Water vs. Collier County Reclaimed. Mrs. Garcia commented that she has spoken with Rober Von Holle from Wastewater, and he is willing to convert all of the Bayshore CRA wastewater. Mrs. Garcia commented that Mr. Von Holle insists that the Bayshore CRA pay for reclaimed water use, however, Mrs. Garcia would like to look at the costs before deciding. Mrs. Garcia discussed the Golf Cart transfer from facilities Management to BBMSTU. Mrs. Garcia commented that John Dunnuck does not agree with having a golf cart on the sidewalk. Mr. Dunnuck feels that it is too unsafe for staff. Mrs. Garcia commented that she will provide an update on the decision to have a golf cart provided for the BBMSTU. Mrs. Garcia discussed the F150 Truck available for Transfer to BBMSTU. Mrs. Garcia commented that the MSTU chevy Silverado was struck in the parking lot at the CRA office and no one left a message. Mrs. Garcia commented that an available regular cab F-150 4x2 has become available and I will process the asset transfer as soon as possible.

Kristin Hood commented that she attended a meeting with Representative Benroich, and she asked if there is any funding available for swales and bioswales within Shadowlawn, when the Bayshore CRA is completing redevelopment projects? 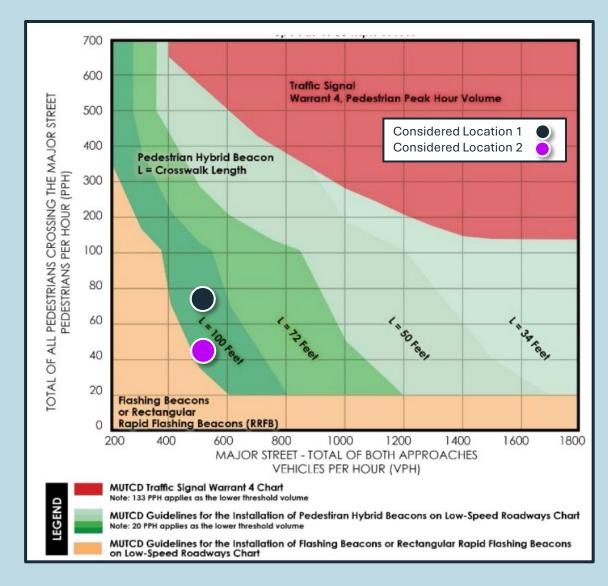




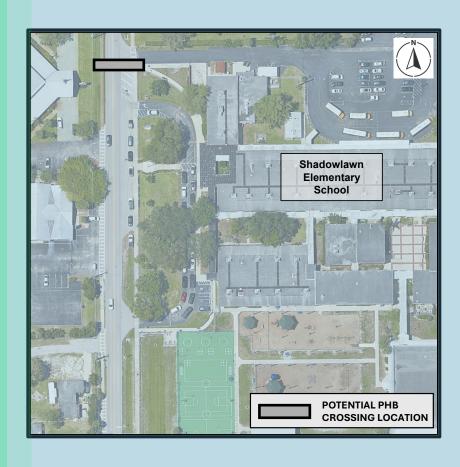


Shadowlawn Drive Page 26 Analysis – Volume





Shadowlawn Drive Page 27 Recommended Pedestrian Crossing Location

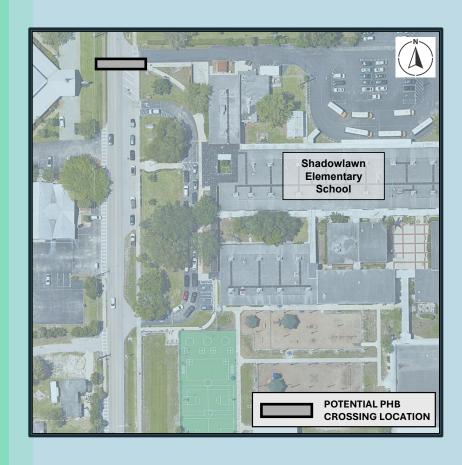

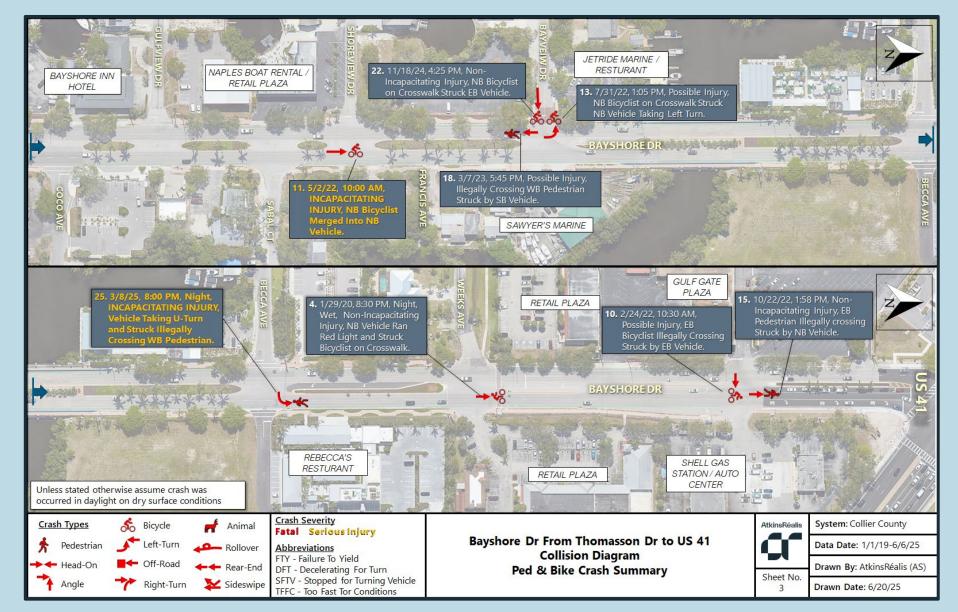






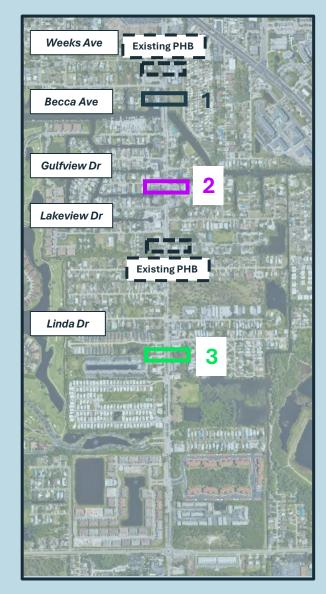


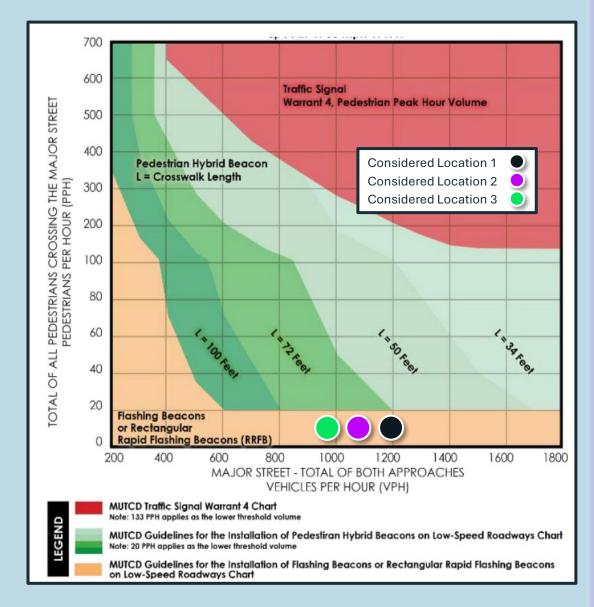




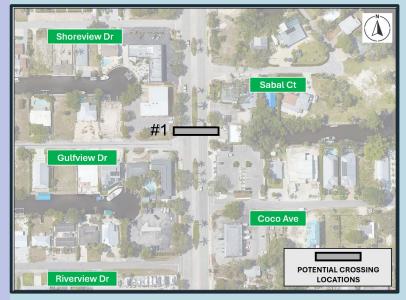


Bayshore Drive Page 36 Analysis – Volume

The attached 2012–21 Ordinance outlines the existing entitlements and regulations for the property (e.g., zoning, density, allowable uses, development standards).

The ITN (Invitation to Negotiate) will include that ordinance to inform potential purchasers of the current development framework.

However, the purchaser will be responsible for any zoning amendment needed to align with their proposed project

Staff is requesting that the BGTCRA LRAB (Local Redevelopment Advisory Board) articulate what the community's preferred vision is for the property's redevelopment — essentially, the board's policy guidance or "wish list."

Example "E." in the MPUD shows a model of how the redevelopment could be framed—likely a list of preferred land uses, design elements, or community benefits.

The ordinance also lists additional allowable uses, so the LRAB can consider which of those uses best fit the community's goals.

Staff is asking for, the LRAB's Review and Input:

1. Review the MPUD and Ordinance (2012–21):

- Identify the current allowable and conditional uses.
- Note the development intensity, height, and design standards.

2. Assess Community Vision and Prior Plans:

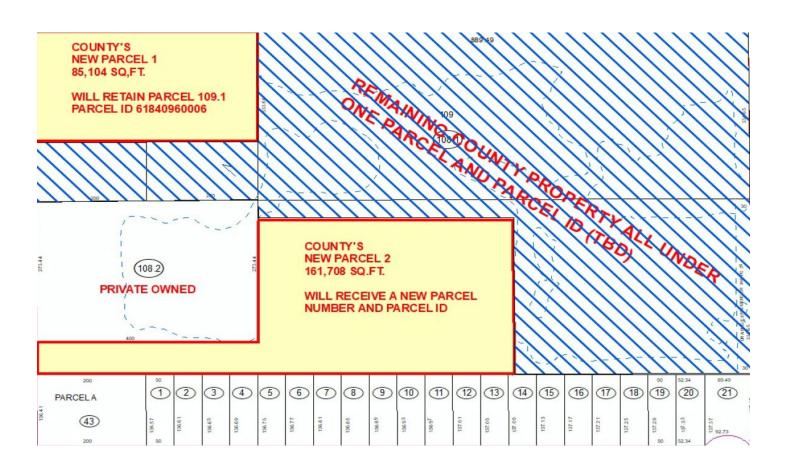
- Reference prior CRA plans, neighborhood plans, or the community's input from public meetings.
- o Determine priorities such as affordable housing, mixed-use development, cultural facility, small business space, green space, or community amenities.

MASTER PLAN

- A. Exhibit "C," MPUD Master Plan, illustrates the proposed Development and is conceptual in nature. Proposed area, lot or land use boundaries, or special land use boundaries shall not be construed to be final and may be varied at any subsequent approval phase such as final platting or SDP approval. Subject to the provisions and applicable sections of the LDC and the Growth Management Plan (GMP), in effect at that time, amendments may be made from time to time.
- B. All necessary easements, dedications, or other instruments shall be granted to ensure the continued operation and maintenance of all service utilities and all common areas in the project.

The alternative proposed is a 10-foot wide alternative "A" buffer on Tract "A" and on Tract "C" adjacent to the MH-BMUD-NC zoned portion of the vacant property which abuts the internal loop road, as shown on Exhibit "C" page 2 of 6.
- 2. Deviation #2 seeks relief from LDC Section 4.02.16.F.2. which states, "Buffers are required between mixed use PUDs, BMUD-NC and BMUD-W Subdistricts that abut residential property. This area shall include: a six-foot high opaque masonry wall; a row of trees spaced no more than 25 feet on center; and a single row of shrubs at least 24 inches in height, and 3 feet on center at the time of planting. Landscaping shall be on the commercial side of the wall." The alternative proposal will allow no buffer along the northern property line (portion of Tract "F") and southern property line (Tract "G") that is located within and adjacent to the lake for the area as depicted on Exhibit "C" "MPUD Conceptual Master Site Plan" and Exhibit "C" page 2 of 6.
- 3. Deviation #3 seeks relief from LDC Section 4.02.16.F.3 which states, "A shared 10 foot wide landscape buffer with each adjacent property contributing a minimum of 5 feet is required between BMUD-NC and BMUD-W Subdistricts abutting commercial zoned districts or abutting BMUD-NC or BMUD-W Subdistricts. However, the equivalent buffer area square footage may be provided in the form of landscaped and hardscaped courtyards, mini-plazas, outdoor eating areas, and building foundation planting areas." The alternative will allow a 10-foot wide alternative "A" buffer on Tract "A" adjacent to the commercial parcel to the north and on Tracts "A" and "C" adjacent to the C-2-BMUD-NC zoned portion of the vacant property as shown on "Exhibit "C" page 2 of 6.
- 4. Deviation #4 seeks relief from LDC Section 4.02.16.A, Table 11 "Design Standards for the BMUD Neighborhood Commercial Subdistrict" which requires a waterfront setback of 25 feet, to allow a minimum waterfront setback of 20 feet (0 feet with bulkhead) as shown on Exhibit "C" page 2 of 6. Lake setbacks are measured from the control elevation established for the lake. Furthermore, lake setbacks can be reduced from 20 feet to 0 feet when utilizing a bulkhead, subject to the requirements of Section 4.02.05 of the LDC.

- 5. Deviation #5 seeks relief from LDC Section 4.02.16.F.2. which states, "Buffers are required between mixed use PUDs, BMUD-NC and BMUD-W Subdistricts that abut residential property. This area shall include: a six-foot high opaque masonry wall; a row of trees spaced no more than 25 feet on center; and a single row of shrubs at least 24 inches in height, and 3 feet on center at the time of planting. Landscaping shall be on the commercial side of the wall." The alternative will allow a minimum 10-foot wide buffer with no wall, same number of trees and shrubs; however instead of a single row of shrubs, shrubs shall be planted in groupings along the lake edge and around the building foundation along the northern edge of Tracts A and D.

1. ENVIRONMENTAL

A. A minimum of 0.55 acres of preserve area are required for this MPUD (2.2 acres existing native vegetation x = 0.25 = 0.55).

2. PLANNING

- A. Building permits shall not be issued for more than 20,000 square feet of commercial floor area prior to issuance of Certificates of Occupancy (C.O.) for a minimum of 20 dwelling units. An exception to this limitation is that building permits may be issued for up to 30,000 square feet of commercial gross floor area if building permits are concurrently issued for all 40 dwelling units and the C.O.s for all 40 dwelling units are issued prior to or concurrent with the C.O.s for no greater than 30,000 square feet of commercial floor area.
- B. All internal access ways, drive aisles and roadways, not located within County right-of-way shall be privately maintained by an entity created by the developer, its successor in title, or assigns. All internal roads, driveways, alleys, pathways, sidewalks and interconnections to adjacent developments shall be operated and maintained by an entity created by the developer and Collier County shall have no responsibility for maintenance of any such facilities. The proposed main loop road shown on Exhibit "C" may be public or private.

MANAGING ENTITY

One entity (hereinafter the Managing Entity) shall be responsible for PUD monitoring until close-out of the PUD, and this entity shall also be responsible for satisfying all PUD commitments until close-out of the PUD. At the time of this PUD approval, the Managing Entity is Collier County Community Redevelopment Agency. Should the Managing Entity desire to transfer the monitoring and commitments to a successor entity, then it must provide a copy of a legally binding document that needs to be approved for legal sufficiency by the County Attorney. After such approval, the Managing Entity will be released of its obligations upon written approval of the transfer by County staff, and the successor entity shall become the Managing Entity. As Owner and Developer sell off tracts, the Managing Entity shall provide written notice to County that includes an acknowledgement of the commitments required by the PUD by the new

owner and the new owner's agreement to comply with the Commitments through the Managing Entity, but the Managing Entity shall not be relieved of its responsibility under this Section. When the PUD are closed-out, then the Managing Entity is no longer responsible for the monitoring and fulfillment of PUD commitments.

4. ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

- A. A temporary use permit must be obtained for festivals and outdoor musical events.
- B. Boardwalk lighting shall be low intensity, no higher than the railing and shall be directed to the walk.

Tabebuia heterophylla

Tabebuia heterophylla is a species of tree native to the Caribbean, and is also cultivated elsewhere. It is also known as roble blanco, pink manjack, pink trumpet tree, white cedar, and whitewood. [3]

Description

Tabebuia heterophylla grows up to 20 to 30 feet tall. Leaves are opposite and palmately compound with five or fewer leaflets. T. heterophylla is considered brevi decidius. Flowers are showy pink, tubular and five lobed (2 to 3 inches long). The flowering time is spring and summer. Its fruit is a seedpod, it splits along 2 lines to shed the numerous thin light brown seeds (1/2 to 1 inch long with 2 white wings). $\lfloor 4 \rfloor$

Flower anatomy

The flowers of *Tabebuia heterophylla* are in an inflorescence of the umbellate type. It is a perfect and complete flower with radial (actinomorphic) symmetry, and the whorls of the corrolla and the calyx are connately joined. The ovary is superior with an axile placentation, two locules and two carpels.

Distribution and habitat

The tree is native to the Caribbean, notably Puerto Rico and the Lesser Antilles. It is particularly common throughout Puerto Rico except in the higher elevations of the Sierra de Luquillo and the Cordillera Central. [5] It can be found in high concentrations in the Sierra de Cayey and a protected area there, La Robleda, has recently become famous for its blooms which happen for a few weeks every year. [6]

Chrysophyllum oliviforme

Chrysophyllum oliviforme, commonly known as the satinleaf, is a medium-sized tree native to Florida, the Bahamas, the Greater Antilles, and Belize. It is also known as damson plum, wild star-apple and saffron-tree. It gets the name "satinleaf" from the distinctive colors of the leaves. The top of the leaf is dark green while the bottom is light brown or copper. This distinctive look makes it a very aesthetically pleasing tree that is commonly used as an ornamental in yards and public spaces.

Taxonomy

The satinleaf was one of the many species described by Linnaeus, appearing for the first time in the tenth edition of his *Systema Naturae* in 1759.

A combined DNA and morphological study of the subfamily Chrysophylloideae found the two main genera, Chrysophyllum and Pouteria, to be highly polyphyletic, and that C. oliviforme is in a clade with other members of the genus. It is most closely related to C. cainito. [5]

Description

Individuals of the species are generally shrubs or small trees between 3 and 5 m (9.8 and 16.4 ft) in height, but under good growing conditions they can reach up to 10 meters (33 feet) tall. The trunks can be around 30 cm (12 in) in diameter. The bark is thin with fissures and plates. It is gray-brown in color. Typically they have only one trunk. The twigs are thin and brown in color. The branches droop slightly as the tree matures. The leaves are alternate and are a shiny dark green on top and light brown on the bottom. They are simple leaf types with pinnate venation. The leaves are ovate and range in length from 3 to 11 cm (1.2 to 4.3 in). The breadth of the leaves ranges from 2 to 5 cm (0.79 to 1.97 in). The leaves are evergreen so they are present year round. These trees flower all year round in some places, such as Florida, and in other

places they only flower between July and October, producing matured fruit in February. Puerto Rico is an example of a place where they only flower part of the year. The flowers are small and creamy yellow in color. They have 5 petals and 5 stamens. The flowers inflorescence is fasciculate. The fruit that form are dark purple when ripe and have a gum-like skin that covers an inner whitish flesh. They resemble an olive in size. The fruits are edible, albeit very chewy. They have several black seeds.

Flowers and fruits

The flowers are small, usually about 3 to 5 mm (0.12 to 0.20 in) in diameter, and have a creamy yellow color. They are pollinated by insects. In Florida, the flowers are present all year round and so are the fruit. However, in some places, for example Puerto Rico, the flowers are only present between July and October. The fruit take several months to mature and are usually ripe by February. The fruit are about the same size as an olive and are green as they ripen. Once mature they turn a dark purplish color. There are normally several black seeds per fruit. The seeds are protected by a white fleshy interior surrounded by a rubbery, gum-like covering. When cut, the seeds ooze a milky white liquid. The seeds are dispersed by birds. They eat the fruit and disperse the seeds in their feces. These trees grow at a slow pace throughout their development. [7]

Distribution

Chrysophyllum oliviforme is native to Florida, the Bahamas, the Greater Antilles, and Belize. It is also used as a decorative tree in many tropical countries. It has been declared invasive in Hawaii and has been naturalized in French Polynesia. They live in warmer, tropical climates because they do not do well with cold and can be severely damaged by temperatures lower than o °C. [7]

In Florida *Chrysophyllum oliviforme* is listed as <u>endangered</u> in the wild, although many can still be found in south Florida owing to their role as ornamentals. [7]

Chrysophyllum oliviforme is invasive in Hawaii. No specific actions are being funded to remove this species, but its cultivation is discouraged. [8]

Habitat and ecology

Chrysophyllum oliviforme can grow in a variety of soil types, including clay, sand, loam, alkaline or acidic, and well-drained or moist. [9] They grow in the sand and shallow clay in Puerto Rico, while in Florida they are known to grow in pinelands and hammocks. They grow well in low elevation moist secondary forests. They have a low to moderate tolerance of salt and a moderate tolerance of drought. [6] They can withstand pH between 5 and 8. As mentioned earlier, they can be severely damaged by freezing temperatures below 0 °C. [7]

Other uses

Hard, heavy, and strong, the wood of the tree is used in construction. It is difficult to carve but good for things such as fence posts, rafters, and other situations where a strong beam is needed. [7]

The 2025 Florida Redevelopment Association (FRA) Annual Conference was held from October 14-17, 2025, at the Hilton West Palm Beach Hotel.

The 2025 FRA Conference consisted of exploring redevelopment in action through walking and bus tours of West Palm Beach, networking with exhibitors and other key community leaders, and a series of insightful seminars and speakers. All sessions focused on the best practices and working towards redeveloping areas to allow the community members to thrive within their environment.

Highlights of Keynote Address:

The Walkable City, Jeff Speck, Partner, Speck Dempsey, LLC: Jeff Speck highlighted the importance of having more walkable cities and provided insight to other areas that have designed areas to allow people to move freely. Mr. Speck highlighted 4 ways to get people to walk, and it includes: a reason to walk, a safe walk, a comfortable walk, and an interesting walk.

Inclusive Transportation – A Manifesto for Repairing Divided Communities, Veronica Davis, PE Director, Cities Program, Atkins Realis: Veronica Davis highlighted the importance of having access to safe, reliable, and affordable transportation. She also spoke on the importance of making streets safer for pedestrians and bringing it all together to make roadways safer.



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Delray Beach Tour: Arts Warehouse – The Delray Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) supported the creation of the Arts Warehouse as a public space for local artist to utilize and promote, and provide exposure for their art. This is a rehabilitated warehouse.





Workspace on 5th Street – Located at 98 NW 5th Avenue, the Delray Beach CRA supported this project initiative to support and improve the economic growth of Delray Beach and also help local businesses and freelancers thrive. Local community members are encouraged to book this workspace.





Boynton Beach Tour:

Boynton Harbor Marina – Located at 735 Casa Loma Blvd, the Boynton Harbor Marina is owned by the Boynton Beach CRA. The marina is a place where the community members and visitors can enjoy waterfront dining, scuba diving, tiki taxi, and parasailing. This marina was purchased to ensure public access to Boynton Beach Waterways and the preservation of the commercial marine industry.







The Tiki Taxi owner provided insight into the growth of his business within the marina and how important the CRA is for local businesses.

Town Square – City Hall & Library – The City's Boynton Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) has moved forward with revitalizing a four-block area. This particular project features a new city hall and library complex, a children's museum, a cultural center and an outdoor amphitheater. The CRA continues to improve the town square, they recently approved a plan to build two eight-story buildings that include workforce housing, retail and parking.







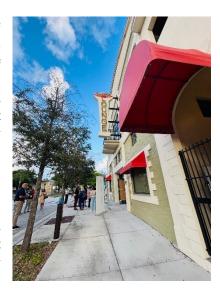


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West Palm Beach/Riviera Beach Tour: The tour showcased the remarkable transformation of West Palm Beach and Riviera Beach through innovative redevelopment and strong public-private partnerships. It began in the Historic Northwest District, where cultural heritage meets modern investment. Attendees explored key revitalization projects including the iconic Sunset Lounge, Styx Promenade, and Heart and Soul Park—all central to the district's renewal and community identity.

The tour continued to the Riviera Beach Marina Village, a vibrant, reimagined waterfront that now serves as a hub for recreation, culture, and economic opportunity. The final stop, the NORA (North Railroad Avenue) District, highlighted sustainable, mixed-use development that integrates adaptive reuse of historic warehouses with contemporary design.







Each destination underscored how thoughtful planning and collaboration are reshaping neighborhoods, preserving cultural legacy, and driving inclusive, long-term growth throughout Palm Beach County.

NORA District Project Summary

In West Palm Beach, NORA stands for North Railroad Avenue, which is the name of a new mixed-use development district.

The Nora District is a \$1 billion redevelopment project transforming 40 acres north of downtown West Palm Beach into a vibrant dining, shopping, and entertainment destination. Developed by NDT Development, Place Projects, and Wheelock Street Capital, Nora blends historic warehouses with modern construction to create a walkable, mixed-use neighborhood centered around North Railroad Avenue the district's "Main Street."



Launched in 2018 and seven years in the making, the project turned a once-blighted industrial area into a thriving hub featuring restaurants, retailers, boutique fitness centers, and beauty services. Early tenants include Sunday Motor Co., H&H Bagels, Van Leeuwen Ice Cream, Juliana's Pizza, and Sweat440.

Future phases include a 201-room Nora Hotel with a rooftop bar and Pastis restaurant, as well as plans for residential apartments and condominiums. The development gained momentum during the pandemic, as an influx of businesses and residents relocated to Palm Beach County.

As West Palm Beach's largest redevelopment since CityPlace (2000), Nora reflects a successful blend of historic preservation and urban innovation, marking a major milestone in the city's ongoing revitalization.

Session Recap: Hot Legal Topics in Redevelopment

This session, moderated by Brenda Thrower, CRA Development Manager for the City of Tampa, brought together leading legal and policy experts to discuss current legislative issues affecting Community Redevelopment Agencies (CRAs). Panelists included Renee Jadusingh, Executive Director of the Delray Beach CRA; Ryan Matthews, Government Affairs and Lobbying Deputy Section Chair and FRA Lobbyist with GrayRobinson P.A.; and Cliff Shepard, FRA General Counsel with Shepard, Smith, Hand & Brackins, P.A.



The discussion focused on recent legal and legislative developments influencing redevelopment efforts across Florida. Key topics included updates to Florida Statutes Chapter 163, Part III, which governs CRAs, and Chapter 189, addressing special districts. The panel also examined proposed and recent legislation impacting CRA operations, governance, and funding.

Attendees gained valuable insight into maintaining compliance, understanding the evolving legal landscape, and preparing for future statutory changes that may shape redevelopment policy and practice statewide.
